

- Creating internal capacity to mount timely epidemiologic and economic analyses and conduct health services research



Model Standard 10.2: Linking with Institutions of Higher Learning and/or Research

- Establishes relationships with colleges, universities, and other research organizations
- Connects with other research organizations, such as federal and state agencies, associations, private research organizations, and research departments or divisions of business firms

Model Standard 10.2: Linking with Institutions of Higher Learning and/or Research

- Conducts community-based participatory research that includes community members and those organizations representing community members as full partners from selection of the topic of study, to design, to sharing of findings
- The LPHS works with one or more colleges, universities, or other research organizations to co-sponsor continuing education programs



Model Standard 10.2: Linking with Institutions of Higher Learning and/or Research

To accomplish this, members of the LPHS work together to:

- Develop relationships with colleges, universities, or other research organizations to create formal and informal arrangements to work together
- Partner with colleges, universities, or other research organizations to conduct public health research, including communitybased participatory research

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Discussion Notes for Model Standard 10.2





 Taking part in research to help improve the performance of the LPHS. This research includes examining how well LPHS organizations provide the 10 Essential Public Health Services in the community and studying what influences healthcare quality and service delivery in the community (health services research)



- Access to researchers with the knowledge and skills to design and conduct health-related studies, supports their work with funding and data systems, and provides ways to share findings
- Research capacity includes access to libraries and information technology, the ability to analyze complex data, and ways to share research findings with the community and use them to improve public health practice



To accomplish this, members of the LPHS work together to:

- Collaborate with researchers who offer the knowledge and skills to design and conduct health related studies
- Support research with the necessary infrastructure and resources, including facilities, equipment, databases, information technology, funding, and other resources



To accomplish this, members of the LPHS work together to:

- Share findings with public health colleagues and the community broadly, through journals, Web sites, community meetings, etc.
- Evaluate public health systems' research efforts throughout all stages of work from planning to effect on local public health practice
