Welcome and Introductions	The January 2024 monthly meeting of the Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade Children Issues Committee was brought to order at 10:05 a.m. by Dr. Cristina Brito and Tenesha Avent. All members were welcomed and introduced themselves.	
Approval of Minutes	There was a motion to approve the November 2023 merged Children Issues and Healthy Baby Taskforce meeting minutes by Vanessa Madrazo, the motion was seconded by Jeff Hurst.	
Executive Board Update	Dr. Cristina Brito provided updates on the Executive Board to the committee. The Executive Board last met virtually on Monday, January 8 <sup>th</sup> , 2023. She provided a high-level recap on the success of the Consortium’s 20 <sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration that was hosted at the Miami Dadeland Marriott on Friday, December 1, 2023. She also recognized during the meeting, Jeffrey Hurst as the 2023 Outstanding Children Issues Committee Member. A reminder was shared, the Worksite Wellness Committee Chair is vacant, and this leadership opportunity is available. Additionally, she provided updates on the continued conversation on COVID-19, social and economic barriers, that are community continues to face. One example that was highlighted was food insecurity. Dr. Brito shared about the recent Miami-Dade County Food Insecurity Collaborative meeting that was held and the Consortium’s presence in this group. As this was mentioned, the committee discussed further on this topic. Further updates will be shared on policy, system, and environmental change efforts on this topic of food insecurity and food waste.	
Healthy Baby Taskforce Update	The Healthy Baby Taskforce update was provided by Esther McCant and Tenesha Avent. The Healthy Baby Taskforce is a sub-committee of the Children Issues committee. During this meeting, Esther McCant presented on the Healthy Baby Taskforce Highlights for FY 22-23 as well as the work of Metro Mommy Agency with the MOMCHA Program. Other updates were shared the Taskforce last met in October. During the October Taskforce meeting, they had an insightful presentation for Maternal Mental Health Awareness Month and Pregnancy & Infant Loss Awareness Month. The Taskforce has also received approval with recommended changes for both designs of the Healthy Baby, Healthy Corner Store initiative. The palm card and business wallet card were translated in English, Spanish, and Creole. Currently working to update and have Taskforce vote to approve the recommended changes. The <a href="#">Baby Safe Sleep Community Survey</a> is also still active and continues to be shared with the community.

<p>Performance Measures in Need of Improvement (Work Plan Review)</p>	<p>Cristina Brito, Tenesha Avent, and Candice Schottenloher facilitated during this committee meeting the Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats (SWOT) Analysis Activity. The last committee SWOT Analysis was conducted in October 2022. This initiative ties back to the work plan activity: By September 30, 2021, the Children Issues will conduct a SWOT analysis and review annually. It was shared that at the next committee meeting the committee will review the final SWOT Analysis. This activity will help guide the committee’s next steps and work plan progress for 2024.</p>	
<p>Recognition of Improved Performance</p>	<p>During this committee meeting, the committee partners highlighted and recognized the success of their community events that took place during December 2023. The following activities and events were highlighted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Buddy System MIA:</b> This partner organization was recognized for its successful work they have been doing in the community on their community fridge initiative. The committee would like to invite them to present at a future meeting to learn more. Carla Sabugo shared they are looking to work with partners in the Hialeah and Little Havana community to install refrigerators outside their organization for the community to have access too.</li> <li>• <b>Consortium 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration:</b> The Consortium celebrated its 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on Friday, December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, at the Miami Dadeland Datran Ballroom. This year’s theme highlighted “20 Years of Community Partnerships: The Past, Present, and Future.”</li> <li>• <b>10th Annual Homestead/Florida City WIC Holiday Health &amp; Resource Fair:</b> This event was hosted on Saturday, December 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at the Homestead/Florida WIC Center. Carla Sabugo shared there were 1,700 guests registered, FarmShare reached 900 families, and approximately 900 children were present with 600 to 700 toys distributed at the event. <p>New Business</p>	<p>Dr. Brito led and discussed with the committee the following work plan activity: By September 30, 2024, the Children Issues Committee will fund a children’s book related to Alzheimer’s Disease and related dementias. During this discussion the <a href="#">Alzheimer’s Association</a> list of books was shared with the committee. It was shared from the research conducted that <a href="#">Grandma and Me (A Kid's Guide for Alzheimer's and Dementia)</a> book could be a potential book to consider to distribute throughout Miami-Dade County. The <a href="#">Dollar General Literacy Foundation Grant</a> was also shared to the committee as potential funding opportunity to consider for this initiative. It was also noted if there was any Children’s Trust funding opportunity available. The committee discussed this activity in detail. It was noted to consider who is our intended audience (6 or 8 years old and older or 10 to 12 years old) and to consider a book that is culturally diverse. It was highlighted possible to distribute these books to communities with the highest rates of Alzheimer’s disease.
