| <p>Welcome and Introductions</p>        | <p>The January 2025 monthly meeting of the Children Issues Oral Health Committee Meeting was brought to order by Cristina M. Brito at 10:00 a.m. All members were welcomed, and introductions were made.</p>  |               |
| <p>Approval of Minutes</p>              | <p>There was a motion to approve the November 2024 minutes by Heather Baker, and the motion was seconded by Beverly Montgomery.</p>   |               |

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| <p>Parent to Parent of Miami Presentation</p> | <p><i>Parent to Parent of Miami</i> presentation was presented by Danielle Leys, Outreach Coordinator. Danielle Leys discussed the mission of Parent to Parent. <i>Parent to Parent of Miami</i> is a non-profit organization and parent center for children with disabilities. This organization prioritizes giving parents training and resources on how to advocate for their children. They are currently receiving funding from OCEP and Children’s Trust. They serve any child with a medical diagnosis as well as children with either a suspected diagnosis or developmental delay. To serve the parent centers, educators, specialists, and psychologists, provide hybrid workshops that provide information and tools on how parents can be advocates for their children. Some of the workshop topics include parent/child rights, IEP, transition meetings, law, and finances.</p> <p>The work of <i>Parent to Parent of Miami</i> has positively impacted the families served in Miami-Dade. During the presentation it was shared 80% of parents report increased understanding of their child’s disability, 75% of parents report decreased stress levels, 95% of parents report materials and information were useful and relevant to their needs, 86% of parents report increased access to services and supports for their children, 96% of the parents attending IEP workgroups increased their capacity to communicate and advocate at school, and 85% of the families attending workshop report feeling confident with making decisions about their child’s education needs. It was also noted referrals to agencies and families are beneficial to the program. | <p>Executive Board Update</p>                 | <p>Dr. Brito provided the Executive Board update. The Board last met virtually on Monday, January 13, 2025. | <p>Performance Measures in Need of Improvement (Work Plan Review)</p>    | <p>Dr. Brito led the work plan review discussion with the committee. There are a total of three remaining committee activities that are trending behind. The indicators that are behind were discussed and include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• By September 30, 2024, the Children Issues Committee will increase from 0 to 2 new Walking School Bus sites. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Dr. Brito shared what the Walking School Bus initiative is and goal of this program. It was shared this committee activity was no longer feasible, as we do not have a lead organization to facilitate the coordination of the Walking School Bus. This activity will not be carried over to the next work plan.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• By September 30, 2024, the Children Issues Committee will increase education to childcare providers about food allergies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ This objective was noted to carry over to the next work plan and redefine the indicator. This includes making the topic broader and not only focusing on children food allergies.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• By September 30, 2024, the Children Issues Committee will fund a children’s book related to Alzheimer’s Disease and related dementias. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ There are no further updates at this time. The committee is awaiting to hear back from the Alzheimer’s Association with next steps. | <p>Recognition of Improved Performance</p> <p>Bounty of Health Recap</p> | <p>Dr. Cristina Brito and Candice Schottenloher shared a recap on the Bounty of Health event. This event was hosted on Friday, December 13, 2024, at the West Perrine Health Center. This year, the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County and the Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade proudly hosted the 5th Annual Bounty of Health event, a community-centered initiative aimed at empowering residents to achieve optimal health and wellness through access to vital services and resources. The event successfully served approximately 150 residents, nearly 400 health screenings were performed, and 17 vendors offered diverse health and wellness resources. This year’s theme centered on healthy lifestyles and overall wellbeing, with a special emphasis on mental health and youth-focused initiatives. With a broad range of resources, engaging activities, and health screenings, the event provided residents with the tools they need to care for themselves and their families. The Caring for Miami Mobile Food Market also contributed significantly by ensuring attendees had access to nutritious food. | <p>Partner Updates</p> | <p>Partner updates were shared on behalf of the Children Issues/Oral Health Committee members:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>DOH-Miami-Dade WIC Program:</b> Carla Sabugo shared an update on the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Homestead/Florida City Holiday Health &amp; Resource Fair that was hosted on Saturday, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024. During this event, they hosted a toy drive during the holiday season and was able to give out 1,600 toys. On April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025, there will be a similar community resource fair but, on a smaller scale for WIC staff members to learn about the community partners and resources available they can take back to the clients they serve and connect them to services. Lastly, it was also shared once ready for release, the WIC program has a new branding kit that will be available.</li> <li>• <b>Gheorg:</b> Dana Klein shared an update on their App. Gheorg is a mental health and wellness app for kids between the ages of 7 and 12 year’s old. They have currently updated their App, and it is multilingual and very multicultural and about 100 languages now.
