	<ul> <li>Partnr305 &amp; F-fentanyl Overview Presentation presented by Amanda Nicol and Thomas Guerra to learn about the work they are doing in our community related to the opioid epidemic, opioid-related incidents, and naloxone usage in Miami-Dade. They have conducted extensive training sessions for over 1,000 community members and delivering detailed presentations to hundreds of officials on Fentanyl statistics and its impact on children in Miami.</li> <li>Mrs. Adebisi, Director of the Office of Community Health and Planning presented the Quarterly Business Review Presentation. During this presentation, quarterly updates were shared on the Consortium Committee work plans and the Community Health Improvement Plan for the reporting period from October 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023.</li> </ul>
