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Welcome and Introductions	The July 2024 monthly meeting of the Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade Children Issues Committee was brought to order at 10:05 a.m. by Tenesha Avent. All members were welcomed and introduced themselves.	
Approval of Minutes	There was a motion to approve the May 2024 Children Issues meeting minutes by Esther McCant, the motion was seconded by Beverly Montgomery.	
Executive Board Update	Tenesha Avent and Candice Schottenloher provided updates on the Executive Board to the committee. Board updates were provided on the June and July meetings. The Executive Board met virtually on Monday, June 10 <sup>th</sup> , 2024. They had a presentation titled Leadership is not a Title: It is a Behavior presented by Florence Greer, Associate Teaching Professor, Public Health Practicum Coordinator, in the Department of Health Promotion and Disease Prevention at Florida International University. The presentation focused on different leadership styles and how one can be a leader with many different styles. It was also highlighted the importance of policy, system, and environmental change (PSE) work that is being done through the Consortium. The Board is working to build synergy as we will host our next Consortium elections later this year for the next 2-year term. 	The Executive Board met virtually on Monday, July 8 <sup>th</sup> , 2024. Updates were shared on the topic of food insecurity, the Mayor's Initiative on Food and Nutrition For All Collaborative, and on the food insecurity screening questions asked through the Healthy Hub at West Kendall Baptist Hospital. The Mayor's Initiative on Food and Nutrition For All Collaborative hosted a stakeholder strategy meeting on Friday, June 28 <sup>th</sup> , 2024 at the Miami-Dade County Main Library at Government Center. The collaborative has been able to establish pillars that they will focus their efforts on which include Policy & Procedures, Funding, Nutrition Guidelines, and Food Pantries & Distributors. The Board continues the conversation on COVID-19, optimal health, and addressing the drivers of health. Some of the DOH-Miami-Dade OCHP staff attended the HESJ Summit in Washington D.C. There were many presenter sessions discussing relationship building, using data to build narratives, research and evaluation listening sessions, transformative policy change, and how to keep project momentum. Other breakout sessions were included with the regions. Lastly, DOH-Miami-Dade shared flyers in English, Spanish and Creole on how to protect from Mosquito-borne illness.
