Presentation: <i>Dementia Care & Cure Initiative (DCCI) Miami Taskforce - Highlights of New Website</i>	<p>EIC member and partner, Martine Charles, MPH, Director, Planning and Population Health, Alliance for Aging, Inc., gave a 15-minute presentation about Dementia Care & Cure Initiative (DCCI) Miami Taskforce and provided online highlights of the new website: https://miamidementiasupport.org/. The mission of DCCI is to engage communities across the state to be more dementia friendly, promote better care for Floridians affected by dementia, and support research efforts to find a cure. The goals include: increase awareness of dementia and of services and supports for those with dementia, their families, and caregivers, provide assistance to dementia-caring communities, and continue advocacy for care and cure programs. DCCI creates dementia-friendly communities across the state. Task forces provide education, awareness, and sensitivity regarding Alzheimer's Disease and related dementias (ADRD), and each local task force has different dementia-friendly initiatives. Some Florida Alzheimer's statistics were shared along with participating DCCI communities across the State. Miami DCCI Taskforce member organizations were shared, and anyone interested in joining should send an email to Ms. Charles. As part of the DCCI Miami Taskforce website highlights, "John's Story" testimonial video was shown. Ms. Charles encouraged attendees to view the other videos which offer a glimpse into the diverse experiences of caregivers of individuals experiencing dementia. The Office of Community Health & Planning of the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County is currently working on launching the community Wellbeing Survey as part of the assessments related to Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP). This community-driven strategic planning process helps inform the development of the next 5-year Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) based on identified strategic priority areas. Members are encouraged to take and share the Wellbeing Survey if they reside in Miami-Dade.
