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- The following activity and related measures under *Maternal Child Health*, p. 15, needs to be completed *by September 30*, 2024, the Elder Issues Committee will identify and collect data that is available on providing familial and generational support.
 - o Was data identified and collected? Yes
 - In past meetings, online data sources, such as <u>FLHealth Charts</u>, <u>Aging in Florida Dashboard</u>, and <u>Miami Matters</u> have been mentioned as sources of data on older adults and health indicators for this population.
 - At the meeting on 9/24/24, a few updates regarding the **2024 Miami-Dade Age-Friendly Community Survey**, a UHP-led community survey for adults 50+ years of age were provided by Mayra G based on a recent email from Nattaliah Earle at UHP. UHP collected 112% of their targeted survey responses for a rich data set to be analyzed and to inform their 5-year Action Plan in progress. The demographics of the responses include 57% identifying as Hispanic, 34% as white, and 17% as black. The survey highlighted housing as the top priority, followed by access to services, healthcare, and transportation. These insights will be used to develop MDAFI strategies to address community needs. On 9/24/24, Vice-Chair Susan H. suggested that we could ask UHP to provide a presentation on the survey findings at a future EIC meeting.
 - At past meetings, Brenda Lampon, the Equity and Engagement Manager for Older Adults, Mental Health and Disabilities, Mayor's Office committed to be a source of data and resources related to older adults and families as needed. However, Brenda L. was not present at today's meeting.
 - Did the EIC increase the awareness among households with grandparents to inform them of local community resources? Yes, Mayra G. regularly shares local community resources and events for children, families and older adults via emails to EIC members.

Natalie Gray, Pharm D., Larkin School of Pharmacy, Senior Academic/Research Fellow, who joined the Consortium's Elder Issues Committee on 7/22/24, was present at last month's meeting on 9/24/24. At the last meeting, Ms. Gray agreed to assist with these efforts, as well as, sharing relevant information for older adults with her other pharmacist colleagues.
