Chronic Disease subcommittee-provided updates on Diabetes event to be held on Thursday, April 12, 2018 at United Way of Miami-Dade Doctors Hospital/Baptist Health South Florida are confirmed to give presentations the following topics: Diabetes Type 2, medical and nutritional aspects, exercise, wound and foot care for diabetics, and fall prevention. This half-day event promises to be very informative and all EIC members are encouraged to attend and extend the invitation to their contacts, including seniors and providers of elder services in the community. Future event presentation topics may include: Obesity, Fall Prevention, Dental Care for Elders Michael Liu, Director, Public Housing and Community Development gave a very informative presentation on the topic of affordable housing in Miami-Dade County. He reviewed Federal, State and local County budget aspects with respects to public housing and community development. He also explained HUD, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, a Cabinet department in the Executive branch of the United States federal government. He discussed private funding sources, such as banks and developers, as well as, funds generated by rentals collected locally. Also discussed, the Housing Choice Voucher Program (Section 8); this housing choice voucher program is the federal government's major program for assisting very low-income families, the elderly, and the disabled to afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private market. 	2. 	Unfortunately, the waiting list for Section 8 is very long; 50,000 are on the waiting list in Miami-Dade County. Approximately 45% of Section 8 are the elderly. More affordable housing is needed along with decreased processing time for those waiting for it. Rezoning	
	could alleviate the situation by allowing increased density. Newly constructed, quality-built units are 20-35% cheaper to operate. Increased partnerships with private	



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	sector/investors are needed and there is interest in exploring new ideas for public housing and innovations for community development. For example, accessory dwelling units, like tiny homes and <i>Granny Huts</i> . HUD must abide by fair housing regulations when considering increases to elder housing. The EIC members were very engaged and had many questions for Mr. Liu.
