Previous Action Items  Board's Role with COVID-19 & Health Equity	Dr. Cristina Brito and Leyanee Perez led the discussion with the Executive Board on the Consortium's role as it related to COVID-19, optimal health, and factors and conditions that impact health. A reminder was shared the Board will further discuss this topic in July as they did not have enough time to continue this discuss in full detail.	
MAPP Kick-off Meeting Recap	Candice Schottenloher provided a high-level recap on the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) Kick-off Community Partner Assessment (CPA) Meeting that was hosted on Thursday, May 30, 2024, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Firefighter's Memorial Building. A total of 62 attendees were present. This meeting served as the kick-off to our new community health planning cycle, introducing stakeholders to the MAPP process, which highlighted the significance of community partnerships and assessed both individual systems and collective capabilities within a network through several activities. The goal of this meeting was to develop a shared understanding among partners in Miami-Dade to help achieve optimal health and address social and economic barriers in the county. Additionally, the Community Partner Assessment Survey was launched during this meeting, which will help inform the development of the Community Health Improvement Plan and Community Health Assessment Plan (CHIP and CHA).

DOH Programmatic Updates	Mrs. Adebisi shared updates on behalf of the Office of Community Health and Planning (OCHP) to the Executive Board. It was noted DOH-Miami-Dade received the Public Health Infrastructure grant through the CDC and continues to complete work through this grant.
