Welcome and Introductions	The Health and Built Environment Committee of the Consortium for a Healthier Miami-Dade meeting was brought to order at 10:05 a.m. by Barbara Martinez-Guerrero.

Executive Board Update	<p>The Executive Board updates were provided by Barbara Martinez-Guerrero. The Executive Board met virtually on Monday, January 13, 2025.</p> <p>The Consortium has completed its nomination and election process for the Committee Chair and Vice Chair roles for the next two-year term for the 2025 and 2026 calendar years. The Board will now host their Co-Chair nominations and elections. The Board has begun to discuss the planning Task force for the Consortium Annual Event that will be merged with the Worksite Wellness Awards Ceremony. This event is planned to be hosted this year sometime around September or -October. More information will be shared with the group, once available.</p> <p>The Board also reviewed and approved the elevator speech, health agenda message, and new partner invite email. They are working now to create a digital brochure format with this info when meeting with interested</p>

When this is available, it will be shared with the full Consortium; this is a way for everyone to really have the same message on how to present what the Consortium is about and what the committees have been working on. Updates were also shared on the topic of food insecurity, and the Mayor's Initiative on Food and Nutrition for All Collaborative. The Board continues the conversation, optimal health, and addressing the drivers of health.</p>	
Presentation	<p>Rob Collins with Hope, Incorporated, works to fight institutional and organizational policies in housing in Miami-Dade County and Broward County. This presentation was vital to the committee workplan tasks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The organization receives calls from anyone who feels they are facing difficulty with institutional and organizational policies. • All services provided are free. • The program is based on laws against institutional and organizational policies in the rental or sale of housing on basis of race or color. Other factors include national origin, religion, marital status, pregnancy, age, HIV status, sexual orientation, political affiliation, source of income, being a victim of domestic violence, veteran status, and more. Performance Measures in Need of Improvement	<p>Committee discussed the 2025 meeting dates, with the intention to schedule two or three meetings in-person with a hybrid option.</p> <p>The Committee Workplan was brought into review by Barbara Martinez Guerrero. If committee members would like to add any topics, updates or feedback, please do so at your earliest availability.</p> <p>The goals that have been addressed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Optimal Health:</u> • Miami-Dade County Housing Authority goal updates: Cynthia Umana, Candice Schottenloher, and Islamiyat Nancy Adebisi attended the Communities of Excellence Conference that was held in Coral Gables. This event held a Housing and Economic vitality workshop in which a panelist from Miami-Dade County spoke on the Public Housing and Community Development. It was also shared that in Miami-Dade, the county was running into some issues because there is lack of space, and other counties are looking for vacancy lots. The goal is to see how these lots can be used to create affordable housing. • Barbara Martinez-Guerrero mentioned the incinerator in the county, looking into how this can impact the environment and the community's health. There are plans to discuss how we deal with waste management and how it relates and connects with the health of the community. The Miami- 	

	<p>Dade County Mayor has decided to drop all plans to build a new waste-to-energy incinerator. The committee will further research and review this issue as a need to the community.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Access to Care:</u> • Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP): Currently, the MAPP process is taking place, and the Well-being Survey is pending final approval before launching. Updates forthcoming in the next months. Timeline has been extended, more updates pending. • Dr. Bethel's team presented on The Scan360 for the November 2024 meeting. • <u>Chronic Disease:</u> • Parks 305 Project goal was reached. • <u>Maternal Child Health</u> • First goal was reached- Candice Schottenloher shared topics from the Children Issues & Healthy Baby Taskforce. • Second goal pending: the Liberty City Connectivity Project with potential update presentation for a future meeting in 2025. The Committee Liaison is working to secure a presenter on this initiative, so the committee may learn more. • <u>Injury, Safety, Violence</u> • Goals have not been reached. <p>We aim to include representations on unintentional or intentional injuries, policy systems and environmental changes for cleaning streets and increasing walkability which falls under this category in priority. We are open to hearing other important factors that we should be considering within this priority. Please reach out if you know of any connections or updates on this topic to be presented in future meetings.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Communicable Disease & Emergent Threats</u> • Goal pending for cultural competency in the built environment. Presentation or update pending for the last HBE Committee meeting in November. • Claudia works with <i>I See Change</i> program that collaborates with school programs by providing information on flooding and extreme heat.
