Advocacy efforts, led by the American Heart Association and Urban Health Partnerships, are pushing Florida to adopt the federal Summer EBT program to support children's summer nutrition. To enhance collaboration and sustainability, a governance structure for the Food & Nutrition for All Initiative is in development, aiming for streamlined operations by 2025 and addressing gaps in nutrition security, especially for children. | |
