They continue to see a 29% rate for food insecurity in our community.  The Board also continues the conversation on COVID-19, optimal health, and addressing the root causes of health. Updates were shared on the CDC COVID-19 and Health Equity grant. A no cost extension was received for one year to complete projects that were delayed due to contracting. Currently the focus continues to be with evaluation and sustainability components of each of the projects.  The MAPP Kick-off Community Partner Assessment Meeting was hosted on Thursday, May 30, 2024, at the Firefighter's Memorial Building. We had a total of 62 attendees present. This meeting served as the kick-off to our new community health planning cycle, introducing stakeholders to the MAPP process, which highlighted the significance of community partnerships and assessed both individual systems and collective capabilities within a network through several activities.  The goal of this meeting was to develop a shared understanding among partners in Miami-Dade to help achieve optimal health and address social and economic barriers in the county. Additionally, the Community Partner Assessment Survey was launched during this meeting, which will help inform the development of the Community Health Improvement Plan and Community Health Assessment Plan (CHIP and CHA).  The Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) Community Partner Assessment (CPA) Survey has is now active for you to complete the survey on behalf of your organization by Thursday, June 27th, 2024. Member Spotlights	<ul> <li>Overview of Florida PACE Centers at Miami Jewish Health by Dennise Nicola, Business Development Manager. Florida PACE Centers provides preventive services so seniors can remain at home and prevent unnecessary hospitalizations, support caregivers, avoid unnecessary nursing home placement. The program is funded by Medicaid and are a long-term care program. They do not have a waiting list; they just have an enrollment process that takes two to three months to be completed. They have a team that</li> </ul>





	will help with Medicaid applications. They focus on offering at home services such as personal care, durable medical equipment, medications, and transportation services. At their center they provide physical therapy, occupational therapy, and day center with supervision, especially those that have been diagnosed with Alzheimer's. If clients live in an assisted living facility, then that facility qualifies for a financial stipend (\$1600 per month/\$1710 starting July). For more information contact: Dennise Nicola

They continue to create partnerships and are inviting partners to see where they fit in in this initiative based on the services they provide (food distributors, nutrition education, policy and advocacy, funding). They continue to have the support of the National Supermarket Association.
