	inspections of properties. Any mosquito nuisance can be reported to 311. They will respond within 24-48	
	hours to help mitigate the issue. They will inspect the neighboring properties as well. Services are	
	complimentary. Currently they have about 320 traps all throughout Miami-Dade County. The traps	





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		monitor high populations of mosquitoes to help detect diseases. Their campaign is Drain and Cover. The campaign has been around since the Zika epidemic. The	
		campaign encourages people to drain any standing water and cover themselves, particularly during the	
		hours of dawn and dusk with either long sleeves or EPA certified mosquito repellent. All the pesticides	
		used are safe EPA Environmental Protection Agency certified registered.
