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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As a reminder, the 2025-2030 CHIP Priority Areas will include Access to Care, Chronic Disease, Behavioral & Mental Health, Maternal Child Health, and Healthy Weight/Physical Activity/Nutrition. The Executive Board reviewed their current work plan (2019-2025) and its accomplishments. The Board is reviewing their progress to see what still needs to continue to be addressed in the new 2025-2030 Consortium Strategic Plan and Executive Board work plan. 	
Member Spotlight Presentation	<p>This month's member spotlight was for Simone Cheong who presented on West Kendall Baptist Hospital's Healthy Hub, which was opened in October 2014 as part of Healthy West Kendall's vision for a healthier community. The Hub follows the AHA Life's Simple 7 algorithm, the AHA's guidelines for achieving and maintaining ideal cardiovascular health. It offers free biometric screenings and additional food insecurity and mental health screenings. The Hub has onsite events to drive people to get screened. They also have a Mobile Healthy Hub for mobile biometric health screenings at local business for employee wellness. They provide resources such as healthy teaching provided by RN on hypertension, nutrition, weight management, food pantries, mental health resources, etc. Healthy West Kendall is seeking grant opportunities to keep the Healthy Hub going for the future. Recognition of Improved Performance	<p>HPDP Committee continues to be one of the committees with the highest number of members in attendance and plenty of engagement during the Partner Updates portion of the meetings. Last meeting, we had 43 members in attendance.</p>	
New Business	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Robert Hill shared updates about The Food and Nutrition For All Initiative. The project team helped with looking at the active engagement with this initiative and mapping out needs in order to develop a strategy going forward and decide how to move into the next phase. Funded initiatives will be starting in January. Robert Hill also shared an update that during the past weekend, one of their funded organizations Buddy Systems MIA was at a food pantry to do a food distribution for the community. Leyanee Perez shared updates about the food pantries, which received large donations from two major food distributors recently, and encouraged members to participate in a food distribution or volunteer at a food pantry as well as thanked organizations and food distributors that immediately stepped up to help out with donations to counter recent food insecurity. The committee continued with the HPDP 2025-2030 Work Plan Development, facilitated by Candice Schottenloher and OCHP team members, starting with reviewing the old Work Plan 2019-2024, followed by a MentiMeter activity, during which committee members brainstormed new committee activity ideas for each priority area of the 2025-2030 Committee work plan. We will be finishing up the MentiMeter activity during the next committee meeting.
