Opdate	still has a Chair vacancy. This is a great leadership opportunity for those who are interested in being a	
	part of the Consortiums leadership as well as being a part of the vision of worksite wellness. The Board	
	continues the conversation on COVID-19, optimal health, and addressing the drivers of health. The	
	CDC COVID-19 grant received a no cost extension for one year to complete the projects that were	
	delayed due to contracting. Islamiyat N. Adebisi and Candice Schottenloher both attended the HESJ	
	Summit on June 26 th to 28 th , 2024 in Washington D.C. There were many presenter sessions which	
	discussed relationship building, using data to build narratives, research and evaluation listening	
	sessions, transformative policy change, and how to keep project momentum. Other breakout sessions	
	were included with the regions. Other updates were shared on food insecurity and security related to	
	the food pantries, screening questions for food insecurity included at West Kendall Baptist Hospital, a	
	pilot program at Nicklaus Children's Hospital, and the mayor's initiative for the Food and Nutrition	
	For All Collaborative. Lastly, DOH-Miami-Dade is sharing flyers in English, Spanish and Creole on

The Community Partner Assessment survey will help us identify the organizations involved in MAPP, who they serve, what they do, and their capacities and skills to support our local community health improvement process. The CPA also helps us identify community strengths and opportunities for greater impact to improve our community's health together. A reminder was shared with the members if they needed to still complete the survey, it was still open to complete.
